
	Diamond/Gold/Industrial & Sand-based (ISB) Minerals Exporter's Licence
	Duration: Yearly (12 months)
	Operation: Required to buy diamonds/Gold/ISB Minerals from any licensed Dealer or Dealer's Agent and export the same.
	Approving Body (person): Minister of Mines and Mineral Resources on the recommendation of the Director General.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

- Completed Application Form (Schedule A – Form 15A & 15B as the case may be) with two passport size photos;
- Proof of nationality (preferably copy of Passport or National Identity Card);
- Business Registration documents: Certificates of Business Registration and Incorporation, Tax Identification Number (TIN) Certificate, Tax Clearance Certificate, Police Clearance Certificate and Social Security Clearance Certificate;
- Confirmation of business address (e.g. Utility Bills, Rent Receipts etc.);
- Work and Residential Permits (for non-citizens only);
- Bank statement from a commercial bank in Sierra Leone with a balance of at least US\$ 70,000.00 for diamonds, US\$ 50,000.00 for gold; and US\$ 10,000.00 for industrial and sand-based Minerals respectively.
- Payment of the prescribed fees.

Processing Time: Approximately seven (7) working days

REGISTRATION

- ❖ Application submitted to the Mining Cadastre Office (MCO)
- ❖ Application checked and registered in the Mining Cadastre Administration System (MCAS)
- ❖ Application Number generated and Application Fee paid to the designated account

SPATIAL VALIDATION

Checks:

- ❖ Coordinates and geometry of area applied for
- ❖ Availability of the area applied for
- ❖ Administrative boundaries within which the area applied for falls
- ❖ Total area of the plot applied for

APPROVAL

- ❖ Application forwarded to the Minerals Advisory Board (MAB)
- ❖ MAB recommends to the Minister of Mines and Mineral Resources for final decision
- ❖ Applicant is notified of Minister's decision and recorded in MCAS

- ❖ Applicant is issued instructions to pay statutory fees
- ❖ Applicant makes payments to bank

4. LARGE-SCALE MINING LICENCE



Maximum area size: 125 km² (square kilometers)



Duration - Granted for an initial period of 25 years or the life of the mine (whichever is shorter) and renewable for 15 years.



Duration: Nature of operation: Any safe and approved mining method exploration methods as stipulated in the Mines and Minerals Development Act 2023.

3. SMALL-SCALE MINING LICENCE


DESCRIPTION

	Area size: Shall not be less than 50 hectares and not more than 200 hectares.
	Duration: Shall be valid for up to four years, renewable for another four years.
	Operation: Mechanized operations that do not involve sinking shafts, driving adits, or other underground openings.

- Completed application form (Form B1, B3, B15, B18).
- Copies of Business Registration documents, including Certificates of Incorporation, Business Registration, Tax Clearance, Tax Identification Number (TIN), National Social Security and Insurance Trust (NaSSIT) Clearance, and a Certified copy of the company's Memorandum and Articles of Association;
- Map of proposed Small-scale Mining area (map should be drawn to indicate relevant geological features).
- Description of the area applied for and total area size (maximum 200 hectares)
- Evidence of technical & financial resources available to the applicant.
- A detailed mine plan and programme of mining operations, including the following details:
 - Mine plan and budget;
 - Environment impact assessment (EIA) licence granted by the EPA-SL;
 - Dredging permit where required;
 - Leases and other surface rights agreements as applicable;

INDUSTRIAL MINERAL RIGHTS APPLICATION PROCESS FLOWCHART



1. Reconnaissance Licence (non-exclusive and non-invasive)

DESCRIPTION

	Maximum area size: Shall not exceed 10,000 km ² (square kilometres)
	Duration – Valid for up to one year.
	Operation: operations involving the search for mineral occurrences and resources by geophysical surveys, geochemical surveys, photo-geological surveys, or other remote sensing techniques and non-invasive surface geology in connection therewith, but excludes drilling and excavation.
	Approval: The Hon. Minister of Mines and Mineral Resources approves the application on the Minerals Advisory Board's (MAB) recommendation.

2. EXPLORATION LICENCE

DESCRIPTION

	Maximum area size: 175 km ² (square kilometres)
	Duration - Granted for a maximum period of seven years, as follows: Initial period of three years and two other renewals of two years each.
	Operation: Testing the land's mineral-bearing qualities, defining the extent, and determining the economic value of mineral deposits using approved exploration methods as stipulated in the Mines and Minerals Development Act 2023.
	Approval: The Hon. Minister of Mines and Mineral Resources approves the application on the Minerals Advisory Board's (MAB) recommendation.
